Intrepid Eyes Hawai'i Potential



Intrepid Travel says its foray into Hawai'i this year has been a hit with adventure travellers and the company is now adding two new departures in 2015.

The 10-day Hawaiian Highlights trip is the only small group multiday tour which allows travellers to explore the less touristy side of the islands, says Intrepid.

The tours take clients to spot humpback whales in Maui, surf at lesser known beaches, explore active volcanoes, and kayak or zip line on pristine Kaua'i—the least developed of the Hawaiian isles.

"While Hawai'i is often thought of as a romantic destination, Intrepid's first Hawaiian trip has been particularly popular with solo female travellers," says the company. "More than 60% of bookings on the Hawaiian Highlights tour in 2014 were solo travellers, with women outnumbering men by two to one.

Intrepid's managing director James Thornton is encouraging people to think of Hawai'i as more than just a fly and flop destination or a romantic getaway. "It's a fascinating place for adventurous travellers who want to see more than a deck chair or shopping mall in Honolulu," he

says. "There are plenty of moments to bask in the sun, but the national parks, wildlife and volcanoes create those lasting memories."

Intrepid expects to see further growth in numbers from Australia in 2015 as a result of the Qantas and WestJet alliance. Travellers can now fly to Vancouver via Honolulu and explore the sun-filled islands before heading to the cooler climates of Canada.
