While there's much to see and do in Waikiki and on Oahu readers also recommended a neighbour island visit to complement a Waikiki stay, says the magazine. the Outrigger Waikiki) is a must-visit, say readers of the poll. There's buffet breakfasts; chocolate hula pie; live entertainment—and signature mai tais in the Barefoot Bar.

Also in the Waikiki top five is 'people watching' and taking in the many colourful sights and sounds of the famed strip of beach—from the street performers to the surfers.

Not surprisingly 'lounging on the beach' also made the Waikiki top five experiences, but despite the generic recommendation, there's lots of different spots along and around Waikiki (Kahanamoku Beach, Gray's Beach, Queen's Beach and Kapiolani Beach Park). Different locations suit for those looking for different experiences-from turtle watching and surfing to the best spots with kids and for those looking to try their hand at surfing, paddleboarding or outrigger canoeing, to name a few). HA Passengers Up

Hawaiian Airlines carried 1.01 million passengers in Jul, up 5.2% on Jul 2014, according to its latest traffic statistics. Demand increased 3.8% on a capacity increase of 3.9%, leading load factors to fall 0.1 points to 84.5%. Year-to-date, passenger numbers are up 5.1% to 6.19m.

Rooftop Concerts
