

Neighbour Island Airport Upgrades
Inter-island travel in Hawaii is set to improve, thanks to a USD10 million cash injection from the Federal Aviation Administration to enhance airport operations and runway safety at two key neighbour island airports, Senator Mazie Hirono has announced.
Maui's Kahului Airport and Hilo International Airport on the Big Island are to receive the funding which will boost facilities at each of the airports. As part of the federally funded upgrade Kahului, Maui's main airport,

will receive a little over USD6 million to support the acquisition of pri-vately-owned land surrounding the approach and departure airspace for Runway 2-20, among other initiatives.
Meanwhile, on Hawaii Island, Hilo will receive over USD4 million in funding for drainage improvements needed to eliminate airfield ponding for aircraft safety purposes. At the same time the second level of the airport is set to be enclosed-and air conditioning added.
"Federal funding for these runway improvement projects will help to strengthen runway safety at the Kahului and Hilo International airports," says Hirono.


New Rooms For Waikiki
The Sheraton Princess Kaiulani in Waikiki has added 76 newly renovated rooms to its inventory, bringing the total number of rooms available to 1140.
