Restoration of the historic USS Battleship Missouri has closed the flying and navigation bridges to the public until next month, but the remainder of the ship is open for tours.

'Mighty Mo', located on Pearl Harbor's Ford Island, is where the Declaration of Peace was signed at the conclusion of World War II.

The Battleship Missouri Memorial runs two daily battleship tours as well as gives visitors a chance to explore the ship on their own. General admission costs USD27 and USD13 for children aged four to 12.

The Heart of the Missouri Tour (USD52 adults; USD25 for children aged 10 to 12) explores the inner workings of the ship with a tour guide. This tour is limited to 10 guests per time slot, and is recommended to those who are reasonably fit and able to navigate through tight doorways and low overheads.
