lava demonstrations, visiting Pearl Harbor Historical Sites, chocolate making classes at Madre Chocolate and dining at The Street; A Michael Mina Social House.

"This is restaurant quality food at food court prices," says Chowfin.

Her final recommendations include a visit to Kualoa Private Nature Reserve, where *Jurassic Park* was filmed, a visit to Waimea Valley and surfing on an outrigger canoe. "It is so much fun, and part of our history," says Chowfin of the canoe ride.

## . . . Island Hopping

Polynesian Adventure Tours offer day trips to the other islands from Oahu, adds Oahu Visitors Bureau. The day trip packages include a sightseeing tour of the island's best attractions, live narration by local guides, round trip airfare and transportation from Waikiki hotels. ### **Kauai By Air**

Some 80% of Kauai is inaccessible by car, says Kauai Visitors Bureau director of marketing Maile Brown, meaning air tours are the best way to explore the island.

"Air tours give a really wonderful sense of the island," says Brown. The scenic flights take clients into the centre of the island, where they will be surrounded by waterfalls. Offering air tours over the island is Safari Helicopters, with a 60-minute ride from USD199-239pp, or Kauai Air Tours, which offers The Big Kahuna tour of the entire island from USD135pp.

### **Hawaiian Art**
