Pearl Harbor 75th To Draw Kiwis



This Dec will mark the 75th anniversary of the Pearl Harbor attacks and tourism operators are expecting to see a spike in Kiwi visitation to take in the events planned to commemorate the milestone.

The 07 Dec attacks thrust America into WWII, changing Hawaii and America forever, and some of those in the Oceania region also have strong links to the attacks, says Starwood Hawaii's director of sales and marketing Dale Carstensen.

Local Hawaiian Airlines manager Russell Williss echoes this sentiment and is expecting Kiwi travellers, especially those with connections to Pearl Harbor or WWII to make the trip up to mark the milestone.

An unprecedented series of events is planned by the Pearl Harbor Committee over 11 days (01-11 Dec) and will honour the commemoration of the attack with the



theme Honoring the Past, Inspiring the Future, adds Carstensen. The events are designed to honour those impacted by the attack—but also attract global and local visitors. While centred around National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day 07 Dec, there's a diverse range of activity planned.

The programme includes memorials dedicated to USS Utah and USS Oklahoma, the reconciliation Blackened Canteen Ceremony at the USS Arizona Memorial, a Pearl Harbor documentary film premiere, an historic movie series planned on Waikiki Beach, a Pearl Harbor Survivor Gala Tribute—and it will all culminate with a world-class live concert that is being planned at Aloha Stadium. Starwood's Suite Ohana Deal: New Rooms

Select Starwood properties in Hawaii are rolling out Ohana Suites, a new room category designed to meet growing demand from multi-generational family groups and friends. The suites sleep up to six and while room configuration differs, there's two bathrooms and a combination of a day bed, space saving wall bed, separate master bedroom and plenty of space. Although it's a premium room type Starwood's Dale Carstensen says they're expected to be popular with Kiwis and the growing number of smaller group bookings Starwood is seeing from Oceania. "We are really seeing an increased demand from small groups of 15-25 people...we're really seeing growth from the sports, multi-generation and fraternal (friends travelling together) markets from Oceania," says Carstensen. The suites are already available at some properties and currently being added at the Sheraton Waikiki, which is seeing a notable increase in bookings from New Zealand.
