Hawaiian Airlines made history last month by operating the first US wide-body commercial flight fully staffed by eight flight attendants over three generations all from the same family.

The eight flight attendants operated the specially named #OhanaFlight, and are all related to Ida Teita who joined HA over 30 years ago.



Hawaiian Culture

The Hawaii Tourism Authority is awarding USD3.5 million to support 124 Hawaiian culture, natural resources and community programmes in 2018, honouring its commitment to fostering sustainable tourism in Hawaii. The funding will go to 124 programmes, with USD1,240,000 awarded for Hawaiian culture, USD1,150,000 awarded to protect natural resources and USD1,153,300 for community enrichment programmes. Also on the 30 Sep flight were pilots Woody Child and John DeRego. DeRego is the son of a former Hawaiian pilot and air hostess, and often flies with his son Nathan who is a first officer. All guests aboard the record breaking flight were surprised with a lei, 500 Hawaii Miles, Primo popcorn, complimentary entertainment, and amenity and keiki kits.

Accommodations Tax

The Hawaii Tourism Authority advises agents that effective 01 Jan, the Transient Accommodations Tax applied to accommodations in Hawaii will be increased by 1%, to 10.25%. This increase will help pay for Honolulu's rapid transit system that is currently under construction.

Kauai Foodie Tours

Kauai's largest chocolate farm and vanilla plantation, Steelgrass Farm, continues to grow, having welcomed even more chocolate trees to its estate, advises Hawaii Tourism. The farm offers certified Kauai-made products, including chocolate bars, cacao nibs, honey and hand-pollinated vanilla beans; and by popular demand, the farm's Branch to Bar estate tour is now being offered four times weekly from 0900-1200. One of Kauai's newest luau is complete with an ocean view, staged under the stars and beneath the palm trees of the Koloa Landing Resort's garden lawn, advises Hawaii Tourism. The luau features music and hula, while well-known Hawaii chef Sam Choy has created a 'feast of delicacies' for the menu and the grand finale offers up a Samoan fire knife dance.
