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Kiwis Report Back From Hawaii





A large trade delegation is up in Honolulu this week for the House of Travel Partnership Weekend, and they're experiencing first-hand that Hawaii's tourism industry is operating as normal across the island group—with only some operational disruptions on the island of Hawaii, such as the closure of Volcanoes National Park, due to the latest Kilauea eruption.

All flights to Oahu and between Oahu and the island of Hawaii are operating as usual, stresses Hawaiian Airlines. There are some air restrictions in

The Hilton Waikoloa Village, located on the northwest side of Hawaii Island, points out that it is 100 miles from the area of volcanic activity.

"There is currently no disruption to resort operations; the hotel is open and continues to welcome guests," says a spokesman for the resort. "Authorities have reported that the air is clean and clear over the resort, and there has been no impact from lava or seismic activity."

Further down the coast, TMG broker Megan Batterton is in Kona, and says it's business as usual despite the Kilauea eruption. "The sun is out; the operators are welcoming and operating; the vog [volcanic fog] is not too bad...and check out the view (above on left)," adds a relaxed Batterton.
