

Tourism Unaffected By New Lava Flow



The new lava flow from Kilauea on the Island of Hawaii has so far spared any of the homes it's crept near, and there has been no disruption to tourism in the region, which is as risk of being cut off if the flow crosses the main highway.

The current new flow is outside of the Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, which is where most travellers experience the lava up-close,

Kilauea has been erupting since 1983 and its lava flows are popular among tourists, who venture close on organised hikes for photo opportunities and even the chance to 'poke a stick' in the lava with operators such as Poke A Stick Tours.

Currently the only Poke A Stick tour available is described as 'an extreme



challenge' not for the faint-hearted. It's a six-hour roundtrip hike from a shuttle drop-off point, with two departures each day 0900 and 1200. Volcano tour company Volcano Discovery says the flow from Pu'u 'O'o continues to advance around 215m per day through the forest reserve, skirting downhill of the nearest homes. A recent update states it's 3.3km from Apa'a Road.

Alternative roads are being prepared incase the flow, which has narrowed as it advances, does eventually cross the Highway 130, linking the Puna region to the rest of the island.
