## **Hawaii Visitor Spend**

Visitors to the Hawaiian Islands spent USD1.39 billion in Aug, a year-on-year increase of 6.1%. This can be attributed to a 4.8% growth in visitor arrivals for the month as well as a growth in arrivals from air services 4.8% and cruise ships 39.8%. The figures show another positive result for Kiwi travel to Hawaii, says local Hawaii Tourism manager Darragh Walshe. For the month of Aug, visitor arrivals from New Zealand were up 3% to 7201, while year to date arrivals were up 7.2% (to 43,085) year-on-year. The four largest visitor markets were US West, US East, Japan and Canada.
