Volcanoes National Park Re-opening

This Sat, local time, Hawaii Volcanoes National Park will re-open to the public—with 280 hectares of 'new' land for Kiwis to explore.

The Hawaii Tourism Authority says it's been more than a month since the continuous flow of lava ceased from Kilauea volcano on the island of Hawaii, and there's now clean and clear air quality island-wide.

The opening of Volcanoes National Park is 'extremely significant' says HTA's Darragh Walshe, who adds it will hopefully reflect a turning point in visitation to the east side of the island of Hawaii.

"The arrival numbers have shown that the volcanic activity (and publicity associated) has turned some tourists away, but now that same opportunity to witness up close an

active volcano will start bringing the tourists back—and possibly in greater numbers," says Walshe.

This comes after the Island saw a decrease in Kiwi arrivals in Jun and Jul, though YTD numbers are up by 1 1%

Most of the national park has been closed to visitors since 11 May due to hazardous volcanic and seismic activity at the summit of Kilauea. 22 Sep also happens to be National Public Lands Day, a fee-free day, so entrance fees will not be charged until 23 Sep, adds the HTA.

The Volcano House Hotel is also slated to open soon, with accommodation available from 06 Oct, something Walshe says is 'great news'.

... Expect Delays

The re-opening of the park is expected to draw in crowds, with the HTA warning travellers to expect heavy traffic, long lines and delays.

There is also less parking spaces available than before warns National Park Services, with visitors advised to seek parking at a different destination such as Mauna Ulu or at the coast. There will be limited services and no potable water as the park returns to normal operations. Agents should advise clients to bring snacks, plenty of drinking water, and a full tank of gas if driving.

Volcanic Garden

Located inside an extinct volcanic crater is the Koko Crater Botanical Gardens, which focuses on rare and endangered dryland plants from Hawaii, Africa and Madagascar. The Honolulu-based gardens are free to enter and are open daily sunset to sunrise excluding Christmas and New Year's Day.
