# Waikiki Holiday Inn Express Now Open



At 44-stories and 596 rooms, the newly opened Holiday Inn Express Waikiki is the largest HI Express property to open in the America's, advises InterContinental Hotels Group.

Located three blocks from the beach and four blocks from the convention centre, the hotel sits well for both leisure and business travellers to Honolulu, with plenty of on-site facilities. The transformation will be completed by the end of the year, after which the hotel will be named Alohilani Resort at Waikiki Beach.

#### **Learn About The Land**

Visitors to Hawaii are invited to roll up their sleeves to learn more about the destination's forest and fishpond environments.

The Maui Visitors and Conventions Bureau reveals there are a number of schemes open to travellers who are open to giving back while learning about some of the sacred places on the islands.

Among the programmes, La Hana Lanai once a month allows visitors to explore the culture and heritage of Lanai island while working on the land or at the seashore.

And, on Molokai, non-profit organisation Hui o Kuapa works to restore traditional native loko 'a (fishponds). Visitors are welcome to pitch in on a variety of schemes.
