Disney has painstakingly collaborated with the local community to offer an authentic Hawaiian experience, and an insight to the local culture. There's on-site cultural trails, and classes and lessons for all ages. Of course there's also the chance to 'meet' Disney characters.

While the resort is often at capacity over the US mainland peak periods—there are often value-add offers for the Australasian market. Check with wholesalers for details

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The resort is busy, and family focused, so it pays to pre-book some experiences to avoid disappointment. The on-site restaurants book out, and urge clients to pre-book the Disney character breakfast (which is hugely popular) as they are not on every day.

Aulani Kids' Club

Aulani's on-site Aunty's Beach Club is incredibly popular, so it pays to take the kids early to reserve a place—especially for popular activities like Stich's space goo and the volcano making sessions (both free). Aunty's was so popular with *Travel Today's* junior reporters that we cancelled planned day trips so the kids could hang out at the beach club.

Parents can go off-property while the kids are at Aunty's and are given a cellphone to take with them, and all children are given RFID bracelets for added security. Kids' meals and snacks can be pre-ordered from the room service menu for the same cost. There's also a host of premium activities (in addition to the huge number of free experiences).
