Gawler Ranges Wilderness Safaris

The names Ballarat and Bendigo resounded around the world in the mid 1800s when fortune seekers the world over rushed to the ends of the world in what was the greatest gold rush ever. Today, the legacy of the great gold rush is still evident throughout the area with attractions like Sovereign Hill providing a fascinating insight into these times. Best of all, the Goldfields region is just 90 minutes drive from Melbourne and as well as a hefty dose of history, visitors will appreciate the sophisticated sister cities Bendigo and Ballarat each offering fantastic art galleries, shopping and restaurants.

Sovereign Hill

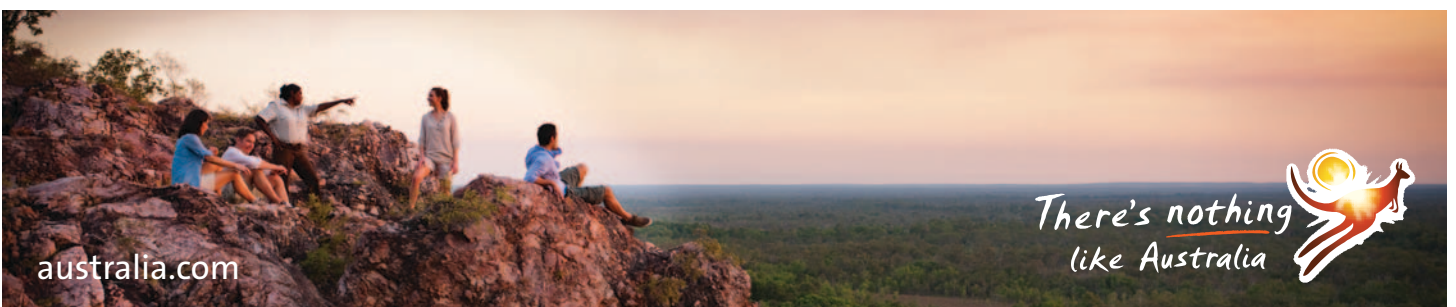
Sovereign Hill is an outdoor museum showcasing what life was like in the gold rush days. Visitors can stroll main street – complete with shops and costume'd characters. There is even a river where visitors can pan for real gold and keep their findings.

By night, Sovereign Hill presents a spectacular sound and light show – **Blood on the Southern Cross**. The explosive show depicts the events of the 1854 Eureka Uprising – a dramatic battle between gold miners and Government forces at Ballarat.



Deborah Mine

Deborah Mine gives visitors the opportunity to experience what life was like for an 1850s miner. After donning a hard hat and miner's lamp, tour-goers drop 228m beneath the surface in an old cage before embarking on a guided tour of the underground tunnels. Guests can learn how to operate a drill and even search for gold – if they find it, they can keep it!



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
