Vineyards and superb food and wine establishments sit nicely amongst this region's stunning natural landscape of ancient forests and a pristine coastline.


The South West is an ocean lover's paradise with beautiful bays and beaches offering excellent surfing, swimming, diving and snorkelling. All of this is just a leisurely three hours drive from Perth.

Wine and Dine in Margaret River

Margaret River is the heart of the South West, and an essential stop for anyone who visits the region. Once a small surfing community, this beautiful destination has evolved into a gourmet paradise with wineries, restaurants and a proud tradition of local produce.

Many of the cellar doors in Margaret River have restaurants, cafes and even galleries, adding a little luxury to the experience. There are also plenty of local experts on hand to educate visitors about the locally produced wine and why the region has earned its international fame.

Margaret River is hot spot for



adventurous travellers too. Here in this stunning corner of Western Australia you can surf, whale watch, swim with dolphins and explore the area's extraordinary caving system.

Getting There

Australia's South West is located in the south west corner of Western Australia and is just a scenic three hours drive from Perth. The region is relatively compact with short, scenic drives between towns making it ideal as a self drive destination but it can also be accessed by public rail, coach, scheduled flights and extended tours from Perth

Tree Top Walk in the Valley of the Giants

The South West is well regarded for its spectacular forests and one of the best ways to experience them is the <u>Tree Top Walk in the Valley of the Giants</u>. Located in Denmark, visitors can walk at nearly 40 metres high through tingle tree forest through trees that reach up to 75 metres. The 600m long tree top walk has spectacular views of the forest canopy and surrounding wilderness areas and is suitable for all levels of fitness as well as wheelchairs and strollers.



At 1.8 kilometres long,

Busselton Jetty is the longest
timber-piled jetty in the
Southern Hemisphere. This
iconic Western Australia feature
has re-opened earlier this year
following an AUD \$27 million
refurbishment.

The jetty, which stretches across

Geographe Bay, features a Jetty Train, swimming and diving platforms, heritage sculptures and a an Underwater Observatory. The Underwater Observatory allows visitors to descend 12 metres down to the Ocean floor via a spiral staircase. Below the surface is Australia's greatest artificial reef, teaming with vividly coloured tropical and subtropical fish, corals and other marine life. The Underwater Observatory has eleven viewing windows at various levels allowing visitors to view the amazing underwater garden at different depths.

Seashells at Yallingup

Seashells at Yallingup is an ideal accommodation option for visitors to the Margaret River region. This 4.5 star property offers a variety of accommodation including studio spa rooms or fully self contained apartments. Nestled amongst stunning gardens and by the sea at Yallingup beach, Seashells is an ideal location from which to explore the South West region.
