How to Get There

Historic West Coast Railway

The West Coast Railway is a steam train journey through mountainous Tasmanian wilderness. The 35-kilometre journey transports visitors back

in time to discover the inspiring story of the pioneers who built the railway more than 100 years ago.

Departing daily from Queenstown and Strahan, the spectacular journey crosses the wild King River and climbs through sheer sided rainforest gorges.
