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Cruise In Kimberley

Kimberley cruising adventures visit remote wilderness areas on overnight or extended trips. Day tours offer the chance to explore the Dampier Archipelago and snorkel the crystal clear waters, take a hovercraft flight across Broome's Roebuck Bay or be dazzled by Lake Argyle on at sunset. Meanwhile extended tours (from five to 14 days) let clients really experience the thundering waterfalls, rugged cliffs and fascinating wildlife of the region, and range from basic to luxury. ... South West

Located just 90-mins drive from Perth, WA's south west region is becoming an increasing popular option for Kiwis looking for a little soft adventure, says GO Holidays. Famed for its wines, forests and wildflowers the region is also home to great stretches of white sandy beaches as well as abundant dolphin and whale spotting. A huge range of walking trails in the south west pass through some of the region's most beautiful areas and offer a great way to experience the natural landscapes of an area. Suggest clients have a go at all or part of the Bibbulmun Track, a 1000km track which stretches between Kalamunda and Albany. The award-winning track, recognised as one of the world's great long distance trails, passes forest, pretty farmland, rugged coastal cliffs and remote beaches, as well as some of the region's most popular attractions like the Gloucester Tree in Pemberton and the Tree Top Walk near Walpole.
