Flinders Ranges and Wilpena Pound

Located 4.5 hrs drive north of Adelaide, the Flinders Ranges feature some of the most spectacular outback scenes in Australia including; sandy riverbeds lined with 1000 year old gum trees, rolling grassland, native pine forests, incredible lookouts and the colossal Wilpena Pound.

Visitors can also expect to see a range of wildlife like kangaroo, emu and yellow footed rock wallaby. It is also a great place to learn about Aboriginal culture. There are many exciting ways to experience the Flinders Ranges including; 4WD tours, bushwalking, hot air ballooning and scenic flights. The best way to see Wilpena Pound is from the air. Central Air Services offer incredible scenic flights over Wilpena Pound from Rawnsley Park Station, putting it into perspective and allowing guests to appreciate the vastness of its formation. rawnsleypark.com.au
