Darwin's Crocosaurus Cove has a range of exciting crocodile experiences including 'Swim with the Crocs', 'Fish for Crocs' and the daring 'Cage of Death Experience'. These exciting activities get visitors up close with Northern Territory Saltwater Crocodiles including some of the largest in captivity. Visitors who are keen to take

the plunge can opt to swim in a separate pool alongside the croc enclosure separated by glass walls.
