Just one hour's drive from the dynamic gateway city of Adelaide, the Barossa is a heavenly destination with quaint towns, artisan food makers and row after row of vines producing some of the world's best wine. The region features over 80 cellar doors many with restaurants and boutique accommodation. A new cycling track allows visitors to the region to cycle through the flat, scenic

countryside stopping in at cellar doors and specialty produce shops to create the ultimate picnic. An essential stop while in the Barossa is Maggie Beer's Farm Shop where visitors can taste and buy a range of Maggie Beer products, enjoy a spot of lunch or even watch one of the daily cooking demonstrations. southaustralia.co.nz


## Blend your Own Wine at Penfolds


The Murray River stretches through 600 kilometres of stunning South Australian landscape and is an easy one hour drive from Adelaide. The best way to experience the river is from the water itself, by taking an escorted river cruise on the Murray Princess – a historic paddle wheeler or by captaining a houseboat with a group of friends or family.

Cruising along the river visitors can enjoy the contrasting landscapes including towering limestone cliffs, historic riverside townships as well as dense bush and wetlands which are home to a wide range of bird life. ## Houseboating

Unforgettable Houseboats allow visitors to experience the Murray River in style and at their own pace as they captain their own 'floating bach'.

There are a range of houseboats available catering for 2 – 12 people and each is fully equipped with all the comforts of home including; dishwasher, flat screen TV, microwave and comfortable rooms with large beds and ensuites. Some of the houseboats even have a Jacuzzi! The houseboats are easily



moored right up against the riverbank so boaties can step ashore and enjoy a walk along the river or partake in a wide range of available activities including golf, wine-tasting tours or wildlife tours such as the Big Bend by Night eco adventure which featured on My Kind of Place. houseboats.com.au
