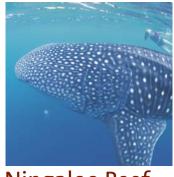
Action Packed Gold Coast

Walls of China

For a unique experience send your clients to the Mungo National Park – the focal point of the Wallandra Lakes World Heritage Site where they can see the incredible "Walls of China".

These ancient dunes made of sand and clay have been shaped by wind and water creating a spectacular sight that is 30 kilometres long. The dune formation has also preserved thousands of years of aboriginal history including campfires, cooking hearths and burial sites as well as the fossils of long extinct animals which have been revealed as the dunes slowly erode.

A boardwalk has been constructed giving visitors access to view the "Walls of China". Mungo National Park is located 110 kilometres North East of Mildura. visitmildura.com.au
