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On-line Market Share Continues To Grow

The on-line leisure and unmanaged travel market will continue to grow by double digits, and at almost twice the pace of the overall travel market, taking 41% of total market share by 2013 (from 36% in 2011), says a new industry report.

The fifth edition of PhoCusWright's Australia and New Zealand Online Travel Overview says air is the largest and fastest growing travel segment in Australia and New Zealand (ANZ), owing to the recent rise of low cost carriers in this market.

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Full service carriers currently account for nearly three quarters of ANZ air gross bookings, but this share is expected to fall incrementally as LCCs grow faster overall, says the report.

. . . Mature Market

PhoCusWright describes the ANZ online travel market as one of the most mature in the Asia Pacific region, due to its 'well-developed broadband infrastructure'. The American research company says Australia and New Zealand represent mature e-commerce and ripe mobile-commerce markets. On-line leisure and unmanaged travel gross bookings grew 13% in Australian dollar terms to AUD11.8 billion in 2011.

. . . Suppliers Dominate

The annual report found that supplier websites dominate the on-line distribution against on-line travel agencies (OTA)—with supplier websites representing an 'astonishing' 82% of total on-line bookings, and 30% of the overall market in 2011. On-line air bookings account for nearly 80% of the ANZ on-line market, but airline websites take more than 90% of total on-line air bookings. Meanwhile, OTAs account for nearly 60% of total on-line hotel bookings, as consumers flock to on-line intermediaries including Wotif-but hotel websites are gaining ground.

Top Cities In 2012

Cross-border air travel between 132 of the world's top cities is still growing despite the slowing of the growth rate of the global economic output, says Mastercard, which has released a list of the cities it expects to receive the most visitors this year. London unsurprisingly tops the list, with 16.9 million tourists expected to visit this year, says Mastercard. The top 10 is rounded out by Paris; Bangkok; Singapore; Istanbul; Hong Kong; Madrid; Dubai; Frankfurt; and Kuala Lumpur.

Skycouch Up For Sale

Air New Zealand will reportedly put its Skycouch economy class concept up for sale to other airlines. NZ chief executive Rob Fyfe said from Beijing today that talks would begin with around 12 airlines over the next six months—a move that could be worth millions in revenue for the national carrier. Fyfe told Stuff that Cuddle Class had proven its value.

NZD Gains

The New Zealand dollar has gained more than half a US cent to USD0.7763 this morning, as Spain's bailout was okayed, says the New Zealand Herald.

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TN Stopover Extension

Air Tahiti Nui has extended its three-night free stopover offer for sales to 20 Jun, due to popular demand. Air Tahiti Nui New Zealand manager Mark Hutchinson says the deal has attracted a 'huge amount of interest' among Kiwis. "Availability has been tight up until Aug, but there's good availability after the Aug peak, and there are still competitive fares out there," he says. Clients travelling from Auckland to the US, France or Japan can stay three nights in Tahiti at the Le Meridien Tahiti Resort or Radisson Plaza Resort Tahiti where up to two kids under 12 stay free. Business and first class passengers can stay in Le Meridien's overwater bungalows, saving \$1548 per couple. Fares are from \$1698 to TYO, \$1795 to LAX, and \$2575 to PAR. Valid for travel to 31 Mar, some conditions apply.

EK Tasman Sale

Emirates has Tasman fares on sale until Sun 17 Jun. Economy fares from Auckland to Sydney or Melbourne start at \$197 ow, and AKL to Brisbane or Christchurch to SYD is from \$199 ow. Business class fares are from \$649 ow, see GDS for details.

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IATA Developments As AGM Wraps Up

IATA's 68th Annual General Meeting came to an end in Beijing yesterday, with a quirky celebration for out-going Air New Zealand chief executive Rob Fyfe, and details on the progress of three key IATA initiatives.

While there's been no official release, reports have surfaced that airline head honchos at Fyfe's farewell bash were handed a pair of NZ underpants to don. Etihad Airways chief James Hogan confirmed to the *Sydney Morning Herald* that he had received a pair.

... GDS Revolution

IATA secretary general Tony Tyler announced that a new distribution capability to handle the increasingly diverse range of air product available to agents through the GDSs will be unveiled in Abu Dhabi later this year. "Multi-million dollar airline product investments cannot break free of product descriptions limited to booking classes like F, C or Y and their derivatives. And personalised offers based on availability, customer needs, preferences or histories are effectively impractical," he says, adding that air ticket sales through travel agents are responsible for 60% of global ticket sales.

"I am confident that the GDSs will join as partners because progress cannot wait."

The organisation launched a Direct

Time Saver Tips

Disneyland's attractions are hugely popular-and with that popularity often come queues. But there's some easy tips to reduce the time spent queuing. The most popular is the Disney Fastpass system which allows guests to get a ticket to come back to one of the more popular rides during a specified time window. Urge clients to get the easy-to-use Fastpass tickets early in the day as there's only a limited number allocated daily.

Tell them to look for the Fastpass distribution area near the entrance of the Fastpass attractions (listed below). Insert the park admission ticket into the Fastpass machine and a Fastpass ticket will be printed with the return time. Tell clients to remember to check the Fastpass return time clock for when to return to the attraction (it's normally a window of 90 mins or so). Clients can only have one Fastpass at each park at a time.

... Fastpass Rides

At Disneyland the rides are: Autopia; Big Thunder Mountain Railroad; Indiana Jones; Roger Rabbit's Car Toon Spin; Space Mountain; Splash Mountain; and Star Tours. Over at Disney California Adventure the Fastpass rides are: California Screamin; Goofy's Sky School; Grizzly River Run; Radiator Springs Racers (to be distributed near 'It's Tough to Be a Bug'), Soarin' Over California and the Tower of Terror. There's also a Fastpass for the World of Color nighttime spectacular.

Get In Early

The queues tend to build up through the day so urge clients to head to the more popular rides first thing. It also generally gets quieter at attractions over lunch and when parades are on.

The Magic Continues At Disneyland



The transformation of Disney California Adventure has been under the spotlight, but across at Disneyland the magic continues.

Rides such as It's A Small World and the Mad Tea Party (the tea cups ride) continue to delight visitors of all ages, while other favourites such as Star Tours (the Star Wars ride) have been revamped to add a new dimension—literally.

The popular Star Tours attraction 3D re-opened at Disneyland last year and now utilises the latest imaging technology to transport visitors right into scenes from the Star Wars movies. There's also now more than 50 ride combinations, so clients can

Single Rider

A large number of attractions have a single rider option. If clients don't mind going solo the queue is much shorter and often fast moving. Interested clients should ask a cast (staff) member if the facility is available. There's also a rider swap option for parents who want to ride an attraction but have young children. Both parents queue, then one parent rides while the other waits with the kids, and then the parents swap without having to queue again. This may not be available on all attractions.

ride it again and again—each time experiencing a new adventure.

Meanwhile, the Matterhorn Bobsleds, which originally opening in 1959 will re-open at Disneyland this Fri following a 'refresh', complete with new three-person bob-sleds that will allow guests to be seated individually.

... Newcomers

There's also a couple of new faces at Disneyland. Merida, the lead character of the new Disney-Pixar film Brave now offers a meet and greet near It's A Small World, and from Oct Periwinkle will join Tinkerbell and her fairy friends at Pixie Hollow.

We managed to ride straight into Tomorrowland on the Monorail from Downtown Disney, ride the Finding Nemo submarines, try out the Buzz Lightyear Astroblasters before the park opened as well as get the jump on some of the popular Fantasyland rides before the lines built-up. A highlight for our junior journos, pictured above, was meeting Mickey Mouse in Toon Town.


