
DL Buys SQ's 49% Shareholding Of VS

Delta Air Lines has confirmed it will purchase Singapore Airlines' 49% stake in Virgin Atlantic for USD360 million.

DL and VS have signed a jointventure agreement to create an expanded transatlantic network and enhance competition between North America and the UK, subject to regulatory approval.

Travelport: Extra NZ Bags

Travelport-connected Kiwi agents can now book Air New Zealand's prepaid extra bags service through Galileo using Electronic Miscellaneous Documents (EMD). The service can be purchased at the time of booking, up to three hours before departure for international flights or up to 30 minutes prior for domestic flights.

VS chief executive Steve Ridgway says the deal will deliver more effective competition at Heathrow.

"The transatlantic market is VS's heartland—it's where we started. By aligning with DL we can continue to grow our North American network and offer greatly enhanced connectivity across the US," he says.

. . . Branson Keeps Stake

Under the deal, the Virgin Group and Sir Richard Branson will retain the majority 51% stake and Virgin Atlantic Airways will retain its brand and operating certificate.

Key features of the agreement include cost and revenue sharing, a combined transatlantic network with 31 peak-day roundtrip flights, cooperation on NYC-LON services, reciprocal frequent flyer benefits and shared access to lounges.

The venture is expected to be implemented by the end of 2013, if all approvals from US and European authorities are gained.

... And From SQ

In a statement, SQ says it had been looking to shed its stake in the carrier for 'some time' as the investment had not performed to expectations. The carriers will continue to honour commercial agreements, including codesharing and frequent flyer programme ties, says SQ.

CX Strikes Off, A Twist

Cathay Pacific flight attendants have voted not to strike over pay during the festive period, but reports say the union members are planning a work to rule—which may include no smiling, not serving some beverages or meals and offloading over-sized bags.

While there's no official release on the work to rule claims, a union spokesperson is quoted as saying 'in a nutshell it means passengers will still be able to reach their destinations except they are paying a five-star price to get a three-star service'.

Meanwhile, CX has welcomed the crew's decision not to strike. Talks between the two parties are said to be continuing.

Webjet Buys Zuji

Webjet has today announced it will acquire rival on-line travel agency Zuji in Australia, Hong Kong and Singapore for USD25 million.

Zuji, which is a subsidiary of Sabre Holdings' Travelocity.com, is the top OTA in air tickets in Hong Kong and Singapore, and is the official packaging partner for Virgin Australia's Blue Holidays. The acquisition is expected to boost Webjet's total transaction value by around 30%. The deal, if it passes regulatory scrutiny, is expected to wrap up in Q1 2013.

South Pacific Cyclone

Meterologists are warning that a cyclone has formed north east of Fiji—forecast, on its current path, to head towards Samoa and past Fiji towards New Zealand. Winds of up to 185km per hour and a 4m swell are expected. An advisory for small crafts remains in effect, says Polynesian Explorer.

Sirince has seen a 30% increase in ow ticket purchases, while Bugarach saw a 40% jump, says the poll.

HA Tops OTP In Oct

Hawaiian Airlines has again topped the US Department of Transport's on-time-performance statistics, with HA flights arriving on time at a rate of 94.8% in Oct. HA cancelled only 0.2% of its flights, representing 12 cancellations out of more than 6200 flights.

New 72-Hr Visa-Free Beijing Stopver

Kiwis transiting through Beijing will be able to stay in the city for up to 72 hours without a visa from 01 Jan, saving them around \$140pp, as it looks to ramp up its tourism industry.

The Beijing Tourism Development Committee has announced the '72hour visa-free stay' policy for residents of 45 countries including New Zealand.

Hue Airport Closure

Phu Bai International Airport in Hue, Vietnam will be closed Mar-Nov next year for renovations and upgrades, HG Travel has advised. Any clients who have bookings to Hue in this time will need to take a flight to Da Nang and then overland transfers (which take around two hours) from there to Hue; or take the overnight train to Hue.

New DXB Airport Delayed

After a lengthy delay, it is expected passengers services to/from Dubai's second airport, Al Maktoum Airport, will commence late next year. Chairman of Dubai Airports Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed al Maktoum says the terminal will hopefully open before the next Air Show in Dubai, reports *Reuters*, and is designed to handle 160 million passengers each year.

KE's Korea Discounts

Korean Air passengers can receive discounts and bonuses at tourist sites, theatres, restaurants, shopping malls, banks and transport in Korea through the carrier's Excellent Boarding Pass promotion. Passengers need to hold on to their pass (with KE flight number) and present it, along with their ID, within seven days of the departure date at any of the 27 partners that are taking part in the programme. The airline plans to accept more partners to the programme. the government will look to support it with plans including expanding shopping channels for transit tourists, promoting the development of night markets, upgrading the airport transfer convenience centre and introducing safety management measures.

The move has been welcomed by local China specialist wholesaler Acrossia and couldn't be better timed following the launch of its new stopover programme, says general manager commercial Wendy Stanton.

"Clients wishing to stopover in Beijing immediately reduce their cost by \$140 per person as they no longer require a China Tourist Visa for a stay of up to 72 hours, and this re-affirms Beijing to be a 'good value for money' stopover city en-route to UK/Europe," she says.

... And PVG Too?

Unconfirmed reports claim Shanghai authorities have also moved to introduce a 72-hour visa free option for selected travellers to the city. There is no official word on the move, but local sources believe any such extension to its current 28-hour visa free policy would include countries such as New Zealand. It would also make the city a more attractive stopover option for Kiwis travelling to UK/ Europe on NZ's services via Asia.

Star's New LHR Home

Star Alliance carriers will be located together in Heathrow Airport's new Terminal 2 when it opens in 2014, allowing easier and more varied connections.

Star airlines currently operate from T1, 3 and 4. Having the airlines in one place allows the minimum connecting time between flights to be halved to 45 minutes and increases the number of possible flight connections by 31%, says the airline alliance.

Tassie's Tourism Focus

The Tasmanian Government has added AUD1 million into marketing the state through partnerships with key airlines. "We're currently seeing record flights to and from Tasmania," says Minister for Tourism Scott Bacon upon the release of the Tasmanian Access Report. Tourism officials are also seeking to level the peaks and troughs the state experiences in tourist numbers by increasing the number of events held there, which include the V8 Supercars, the AFL and high-profile events at MONA. An access development advisor will also be appointed to work with stakeholders and airlines on access, by sea and air, in the future.

WA Whale Sharks Safe

Whale sharks and their migration patterns aren't affected by eco-tourism, as long as it is well regulated, a new study has reportedly found.

Tourism has little effect on whale sharks and their migration patterns, with those that encounter tourists just as likely to return to the reef as those that don't, according to research conducted over five years at Ningaloo by the Australian Institute of Marine Science and University of Western Australia.

The study found that the Ningaloo ecotourism industry in its current form is ecologically sustainable into the future, the West Australian reported.

Egypt Vote Protests, No Tourists Targeted

As Egyptians prepare to vote on the country's new constitution Sat, international media reports suggest protests in major cities could become intense-however Innovative Travel says since the overthrow of Hosni Mubarak's regime earlier this year, no anger or violence has been aimed at tourists visiting the country.

There will be a period of increased protests over the next two or three days, however this is not a time when New Zealanders traditionally visit Egpyt.

"Our own feedback from clients con-

"The rules have not changed for tourists," she says.



- If you want a quieter area the Solstice deck, the highest point of the ship, is a nice place to get away.




