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## Low Fares, Cheaper Deals Double-edged

Statistics New Zealand has released its first quarter 2015 Consumer Price Index figures—showing a 15% drop in international airfares and a 6.6% fall in package holidays for the Mar 2015 quarter, compared to the previous (Dec 2014) quarter.

While some say the results are great for the travel industry, one retail brand has also pointed out the lower cost may come at a price for the trade.

“This week’s results from the Consumer Price Index are very positive for the travel industry,” says Flight Centre New Zealand general manager product Simon McKearney.

“At Flight Centre we’ve seen encouraging growth already this year and lower fares and package holidays are a key driving force behind this. The market is certainly buoyant.”

However, from a trade perspective, McKearney says the figures are something of a double-edged sword. “Lower fares and holiday package prices equate to lower transacting revenue coming through the doors for the same amount of holidays sold—meaning we are now needing to sell more product to reach targets set by our supply partners.”

### ... Record Year?

House of Travel says more Kiwis are travelling and the chain is expecting it to be a record year in terms of travel. “There’s definitely more confidence in the market, however there may be some impact due to the lower dairy pay-out, but that may not flow down until some stage in the future as not all dairy farmers have debt,” says HoT commercial director Brent Thomas. “Unemployment’s also trending down and the overall wage growth is greater than inflation so people have got more money in their pockets.”

Thomas says those factors, combined with the falling airfares are fantastic for the travelling Kiwi. “And we may not have seen the full [impact] from lower oil cost and I expect we’ll continue to see some very competitive [airfare] pricing going forward, which is supported by the number of airlines now looking at new routes, they won’t do that unless they were confident there was going to be enough demand to fill those seats,” says Thomas


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**Common Border To Show Anzac Spirit?**

**New Zealand and Australia aren't as close as we think we are and one of the best ways to improve our Anzac relationship would be to allow travel across the Tasman without passports, says Immigration Minister Peter Dunne.**

Dunne has released his 'thoughts on the Anzac connection' and says while Australia and New Zealand refer to each other as family, 'the relationship is more akin to that of the distant cousin, rather than the close sibling we like to portray it as'.

This weekend is the perfect time to breathe fresh life into the modern relationship between the two countries, says Dunne.

"As two equal sovereign states, let us honour our forebears by making our relationship the closest of any two nations on earth. A practical starting point would be to allow our respective citizens free movement across our borders, without the need for a passport, as is increasingly the case in Europe," says Dunne.

"The spectacular memorial gift to grace Wellington's Pukeahu park is one thing—but, Mr Abbott, a move on passports would be a much more enduring recognition of the bond we say we forged at Gallipoli."

**... TAANZ Support**

TAANZ boss Andrew Olsen has voiced his support for Dunne's comments, saying it's worked before and this year marks the perfect time to reintroduce the topic.

"The EU community have this freedom and it works well. Customs and border control effectiveness is now significantly stronger than it was back in the 1980s when the passport requirement was reintroduced," says Olsen.

"Anything we can do to 'domesticate' this travel experience and make it a little more affordable has to be a bo-

nus for consumers and travel agents making the arrangements."

**... Background**

The prospect of a common border between Australia and New Zealand has been discussed in the past, and in 2009 both governments said such a move was underway—but an announcement never eventuated, with problems aligning customs and immigration processes said to be a deterrent. However organisations including the Tourism and Transport Forum have continued to lobby for the move.



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**The NZD-AUD Parity Buzz Continues**



**Travel Money New Zealand is reporting ongoing high demand for AUD due to the NZD-AUD rate 'still being so amazing.'**

AUD is Travel Money's top seller, and earlier this month the company reported that Kiwi consumer demand for AUD had reached fever pitch as talk of the Kiwi dollar reaching parity with the AUD intensified.

Despite the Reserve Bank's decision to hold interest rates, Flight Centre's foreign exchange business held its own 'parity party' offering Kiwis NZD-AUD parity for two days earlier this month. The result was queues out the doors and down the street (as pictured).

## Double-Digit Growth For CX In Mar

**Cathay Pacific Airways' combined Cathay Pacific and Dragonair figures for Mar show a double-digit increase in the number of passengers carried compared to the same month in 2014.**

The airlines carried a total of 2,887,106 passengers in Mar, an increase of 11% from Mar 2014. The passenger load factor grew by 5 percentage points to 87.3% whilst capacity increased by 5.7%.

For the first quarter of 2015 passenger traffic grew by 8.6% while capacity was up by 6.9%.

CX says Mar is traditionally a shoulder season between the Chinese New Year and Easter peak periods, but this year saw passenger demand for the month rising above expecta-

tions. Demand was strong in all cabins, with high load factors to and from Southwest Pacific, Europe and the UK. Demand on the US routes caught up with the big increase in capacity introduced last year, it says, while travel in the region, particularly to Japan, Thailand and Singapore, was strong. However, demand to Europe remained below expectations, with business affected by the ongoing economic woes and depreciation of the euro.

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
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
