RCCL Changes Discounts Stance

Kiwi agents have welcomed the news that Royal Caribbean Cruises Ltd (RCCL) has stopped its lastminute cruise discounting in North America

An un-named local cruise expert says the move is great news for the travel industry as there's nothing worse than passengers on-board finding out they didn't get the best deal.

"It makes them very unsettled," they say, adding passengers need to feel confident that they won't be paying too much by booking early. "Those booking far out should get the best deal... I applaud this decision."

RCCL's chairman Richard Fain has been quoted as saying the move may cost them bookings in the short term, but they believe the long-term advantage for its brands will be worth it.

"Over time we believe this will lead to happier guests, happier agents, and better branding," he was quoted as saying.

Fain called the discounted prices 'disruptive to the system', saying they upset many of their most loyal customers by creating uncertainty about the price they pay, as well as causing headaches for travel agents who don't know which price to rely on, all while undermining the brand image.

... Positive News

House of Travel Milford owner Mary Shields believes the announcement is a positive thing for the industry. Shields says there needs to be consistency and integrity in the pricing and if one market has a massive discount then that needs to be available for other markets.

House of Travel general manager of cruise Linda Halliday agrees, saying it is a 'fantastic' move on behalf of the cruise line.

"Our biggest competition is websites and global websites as our customers are savvy and like to research and are quick to find pricings in other markets," she says. "To be able to compete on a level playing field is a huge bonus for us."

The report says the only exception to the policy is for short cruises of up to four days.

. . . Capacity Priority

A Carnival New Zealand spokesperson says, across all its cruise line brands, it strives to maintain price integrity from launch fares and occasionally prices are reduced close to sailing to fill capacity, but this is done in partnership with agents to ensure veracity of value. They say it always intends to sail with a full cruise, because it's good for the agent, passengers and cruise line. "The Australian and New Zealand market is a competitive sector with pricing structures a topic of industry discussion to help drive growth and best practices across the category," the spokesperson says.

Nepal Update: Trips Cancelled

The New Zealand Government is advising against all tourist and other non-essential travel to Nepal, where a state of emergency has been declared due to the damage and destruction caused by the Sat earthquake and continuing aftershocks.

Tribhuvan International Airport, Kathmandu has re-opened with national and international flights resuming services, however MFAT says delays are very likely.

The Intrepid Group, which had 14 Kiwis on its Nepal tours at the time the earthquake struck and 168 travellers in total, says its travellers have been accounted for and are safe and well.

However, Intrepid says communications in Nepal remain difficult, as are onward arrangements for its travellers, with landline and internet connections down, damage to roads and infrastructure and the international

airport operating at limited capacity. "Our local team in Kathmandu has been working hard to ensure the ongoing safety and comfort of our travellers, and make onward arrangements for their travel as soon as we are able to do so. . . While some groups have now left the country, logistics remain a challenge in the area. We continue to assess the best options for travellers to get back to Kathmandu and fly out." Intrepid says each group outside of Kathmandu is with an experienced leader and those within Kathmandu are being looked after by the office team directly. The company has cancelled all imminent departures to Nepal, up to and including 11 May,

whilst departures scheduled after 12

May will be reviewed as appropriate.

Adventure World's New Zealand clients have also been accounted for and are safe in Kathmandu. The wholesaler says its local team has been looking after its clients and is making onward arrangements for their travel.

Adventure World says clients booked in upcoming Nepal trips in the immediate weeks ahead have been cancelled and travel agencies affected have been notified. The company is monitoring the situation and says it will review subsequent trips as appropriate. All current and upcoming Adventure World and Exodus trips in India will operate as normal, it says.
