

NZ Offshore Rejig; Local Moves Next?

Air New Zealand has announced major changes to its global regional management team and there's also speculation the carrier may now be eying some



NZ has been forthcoming in its plan to achieve global mobility, and yesterday rolled out a new regional general manager structure, which includes new regional roles in Asia and the Americas. The carrier has also outlined plans to increase its presence in Australia.

However, NZ has declined to comment on persistent rumours changes are coming at a local level.

Nick Judd (pictured on left) and Scott Carr headline NZ's global rejig. Judd, currently gm of China, has been appointed to the role of regional gm Americas; while Carr, NZ's Japan manager, has been promoted to take on a new regional gm Asia role. Both roles are effective 31 Mar.

Credited with helping turn NZ's China operation into profitability, in a statement NZ chief commercial officer Cam Wallace says Judd

will also assume responsibility of NZ's South America region from 30 Jun.

"I look forward to his leadership playing a significant role in defending our existing North American routes and building demand on our new Houston and Buenos Aires services," says Wallace. Judd will also oversee NZ's partnership with United Airlines.

Carr will be responsible for Japan, China, Hong Kong, Singapore and Vietnam, based in Shanghai. Wallace says in an announcement that Carr has demonstrated a strong ability to succeed in a challenging Asian business context. "I look forward to the benefit of his highly commercial approach across the wider Asian region going forward," says Wallace.

... Next Trade Deal?

Locally, there have already been some moves with NZ's trade facing staff, and industry sources suggest there may be more NZ changes to come.

There are also strong signs helloworld could be set to be the second company to ink a strategic deal with the national carrier.

NZ's Increased Oz Focus

Air New Zealand has also signalled plans to substantially increase its presence in the Australian market, as it moves to meet its strategic targets, specifically significant long-haul passenger growth ex Australia.

"We're moving to a state-by-state strategy and investing significantly in Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, New South Wales and Western Australia," says NZ chief commercial officer Cam Wallace in a statement.

While NZ has yet to announce how many jobs the move will create across the Tasman, NZ has confirmed that the carrier is looking to appoint someone to a newly-created regional general manager Australia role.


"[The appointment] will reflect our elevated presence in this market and the drive to establish Auckland as an Australasian hub for long haul traffic," Wallace says in the announcement.

Found: Three Planes

Kuala Lumpur International Airport has taken out a classified ad in Malaysia to track down the owner of three Boeing 747s which have been abandoned at the airport. There's two white and one 'off-white' 747-200Fs which have been parked at KUL for more than a year, and no one knows who they belong to. If they're not claimed, the airport plans to sell or 'otherwise dispose' of them. Malaysia Airlines has reportedly denied ownership.

New Angkor Wat Rules

Cambodia has reportedly released a code of conduct for visitors at Angkor Wat, which includes banning selfies with monks, skimpy clothing, smoking, littering and giving money or gifts to begging children. There's signs in the temples and local hotels, and a new video detailing the code of conduct, as the site's managing authority looks to protect the country's most popular attraction.





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
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Trump Hotel Boycott

Travel consultancy firm IdeaWorks is calling on the travel industry to boycott Donald Trump's hotels and other businesses following his call for a 'total ban' on Muslims entering the US.

IdeaWorks president Jay Sorenson says Trump's views 'hurt the travel industry as a whole by urging a more divided world'. "I will not step foot inside a Trump Hotel or patronise any Trump enterprise to attend a conference, stay overnight, or dine in his restaurants," he says. "Mine is a small firm but it's a statement I am compelled to make as a travel industry professional and as an American."

Meanwhile some news reports have pointed out that many of Trump's business interests are in countries with high populations of Muslim people, including a golf resort in Dubai and hotel in Bali.



Pax, Agents Missing New SA Rules

South African Airways says it's been unable to check in a 'large number' of passengers on recent flights out of Australia, because they didn't have the correct documentation needed when travelling with children or for unaccompanied minors.

Last week on a flight from Perth, the carrier couldn't check a number 'in the high double digits' of passengers because they didn't have the right documents, says SAA country manager Tim Clyde-Smith.

Boeing's New 737 MAX 8



Boeing has celebrated the completion of final assembly of the first 737 MAX 8 aircraft—a milestone that was achieved on time, per plan, says the manufacturer.

The aircraft will now undergo preflight preparation in the factory before departing for Renton Field to continue flight test readiness. It's on track for first flight in early 2016, and with the second and third flight test airplanes currently in final assembly and the fourth (and final) in sub-assembly, the 737 MAX remains on track for first delivery to launch customer Southwest Airlines in the third quarter of 2017. "This is amplified when they have travelled across Australia from the eastern states or New Zealand and are then advised they cannot continue their journey without the correct documentation being provided," he says. "As our Christmas flights are full, we cannot then accommodate people on another flight, meaning many families' holiday plans are ruined. Such oversights by our travel partners or our customers are not covered by travel insurance."

As of 01 Jun, parents and guardians travelling with children, or unaccompanied minors travelling alone or in groups, need to carry extra documentation.

Agents are urged to make themselves familiar with the rules and inform their clients—including those who booked before the legislation came into force.

"We have found many examples of people who made bookings through agents earlier this year are simply unaware of the new requirements," he says.

While both NZ and helloworld have declined to comment, there is increased speculation that the pair are now in talks on a deal that would encompass helloworld's interests on both sides of the Tasman. NZ boss Christopher Luxon met with helloworld New Zealand head Simon McKearney in Wellington recently, and the carrier has already signalled its support of McKearney's leadership (and the move to a single retail brand). Travel Today understands the relationship between the two companies has significantly improved and that negotiations on a new deal are ongoing.

It marks the fifth Ramada resort to open in New Zealand.

The range of measures identified includes immediately modifying the ESTA application process to find out if travellers have visited any countries 'constituting a terrorist safe haven'.

The Department of Homeland Security is to review and report to the president on possible pilot programmes that use biometrics to increase security; and the US will promote its Global Entry programme, which uses biometrics, among VWP partners, in an effort to further expand it.

The fines faced by airlines who fail to verify a traveller's passport data are also set to increase; and the government is also looking to expand its preclearance programme to countries including Belgium, Japan, Norway, Netherlands, Spain, Sweden and the UK.
