Disney: New Parks, Rides & Win A Trip

It's a big week for Disney Destinations as the company celebrates the official launch of its new Shanghai resort, the opening of new and reimagined attractions in the US—and Mickey Mouse even arrived in Auckland.

More than 150 agents attended this morning's Disney Days trade event in Auckland for an update on what's new and what's next across the ever expanding Disney network.

Kiwi visitation to the Disney parks around the globe continues to climb and the company has also noted some Disney Cruise Line growth, albeit off a small base.

"Feedback suggests we're seeing greater numbers of Kiwis travelling to Aulani and Disneyland; and with the increased air capacity coming on line, we are expecting to see increased demand for Walt Disney World," says Disney Destinations' Michael Cas-

sis. "Disneyland remains our most popular resort for Kiwis, but with the repeat travellers to the US looking for something new, we think we'll see more demand for Walt Disney World. We'll be working with agents to grow awareness of the destination."

Cassis says the sheer scale of Disney's Orlando resort (with more than 100 rides across four parks and 26 on-site hotels) means it's a different proposition for agents to sell and he suggests a minimum of five-seven nights to really experience the resort.

As part of its efforts to raise awareness, Disney Destinations is offering Kiwi retail and wholesale consultants the chance to win a place on a Walt Disney World famil later this year, offered in conjunction with DL and VA. See upcoming issues for more details.

Disney Destinations has reiterated its commitment to the trade distribution. All Disney Parks collateral continues to have a call to action to agents and the company has also just refreshed its on-line training offering. New training modules for Disneyland, Walt Disney World and Aulani went live this morning on its disneytravelagents.co.nz website. "It's a great new platform and things are a bit more streamlined. As well as the on-line training it's where travel agents can access their industry discounts, so it's a resource all agents should be familiar with," adds Cassis.

Russia's Plane To Rival Boeing, Airbus?



Russia has revealed its new MC-21 passenger plane, which state media says will rival the likes of Boeing and Airbus, as it is 'superior to its Western-made counterparts in many respects'.

The twin-engine short and medium range aircraft is not made of metals, but instead composite materials, making it 'much lighter and stronger'. The plane will be built in two variants, the MC-21-300 which will have 160-211 seats and the MC-21-

EK Aussie On Sale

Emirates has flights to Australia on sale today only, with fares starting from \$195 Christchurch-Sydney, while fares ex Auckland start from \$197 to Brisbane, \$200 to Sydney and \$222 to Melbourne. See GDS for details

200 which will have 130-165 seats. Deliveries are expected to start in 2018 and numerous contracts with both domestic and foreign carriers have reportedly already been agreed.

Cuba Airlines Approved

The US has approved flights on six US airlines to cities in Cuba, with flights set to launch as early as the northern autumn—however a decision on flights to Havana is yet to be made. American Airlines has been approved to fly from Miami; Southwest, JetBlue and Silver Airways from Fort Lauderdale; Frontier from Chicago and Philadelphia; and Sun Country from Minneapolis. Airlines have applied for almost three times as many of the 20 daily round-trips permitted to Havana, and a decision on flights to the city is due to be made this northern summer.

DXB Drone Disrupt

Dubai International Airport was closed for over an hour on Sat after a drone flew into its airspace, reports *Reuters*, causing 22 flights to be diverted. The flying of drones is prohibited within 5km of airports, helipads, landing areas or manned aircraft in the UAE.

Uber Bomb Error

An Uber driver who tried to hide his phone unwittingly caused a bomb scare at Bangkok Suvarnabhumi Airport last week. Two mobile phones in a clear plastic bottle were found by joggers near the airport, and they alerted the authorities who brought in bomb disposal experts. However it's now believed the phone's owner was an Uber driver who was trying to escape detection, as Uber is illegal in Thailand and authorities have been known to track drivers through the app.


