IATA: People Still Want To Travel

Global passenger traffic demand for Jul showed growth over the previous five months, largely thanks to lower fares and shows people want to travel despite lingering impacts from terror attacks and a fragile economic backdrop, says IATA.

"Jul saw demand strengthen, after a softening in Jun. Demand was stimulated by lower fares, which, in turn were supported by lower oil prices. And near record high load factors demonstrate that people want to travel. But, there are some important sub-plots to the narrative of strong



demand," says IATA boss Alexandre de Juniac. "Long-haul travel to Europe, for example, suffered in the aftermath of a spate of terrorist attacks."

Total demand rose 5.9%, year-on-year, with all regions reporting growth. Monthly capacity rose 6% and average loads were 83.7%, just 0.1 percentage point below the record Jul high achieved in 2015.

IATA says Jul international passenger demand rose 7.1% on Jul 2015, which was an increase over the 5% yearly increase in Jun. Airlines in all regions recorded growth; with total capacity climbing 7.3%, causing load factors to slip 0.2 percentage points to 83.5%. In particular for Asia-Pacific airlines, traffic rose 9.8%; capacity increased 8.6% and load factor climbed 0.9 percentage points to 81.7%.

De Juniac adds that while passenger demand has broadly grown in line with the average of the past 10 years, the industry faces some potential headwinds. "The environment in which aviation operates is dynamic—even volatile," he says. "Speed is of the essence. As an industry we must be prepared for rapid innovation in order to manage shocks and take advantage of opportunities as they arise."

Man's 18-day SIN Stay

A man who spent 18 days living in executive lounges at Singapore Airport by creating fake boarding passes has reportedly been sent to jail.

The Malaysian man is said to have missed his flight and then spent the next 18 days sleeping on chairs, eating in the lounges and using their showers. He apparently downloaded images of mobile boarding passes and used software on his laptop to add his name.

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Global Security Call

UK Prime Minister Theresa May is set to promote a resolution for proper bag checks and a ban on liquids at airports around the world during her trip to the United Nations in New York, say reports.

The resolution would mean countries across the globe would be encouraged to provide the same, high levels of security.

At the same time, the reports say all countries would be encouraged to enforce the rules of the International Civil Aviation Organisation.

The British PM is also proposing that richer countries would help meet the cost of the border security improvements in developing countries.





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Airport Tower Unmanned

Two flights into Palmerston North on Mon evening reportedly had to be cancelled as the city's airport tower went unmanned for a few hours, after staff called in sick. Airways told stuff.co.nz that it was an unusual event and apologised for the inconvenience caused.

Nigeria's Fuel Problems

Nigeria's Arik Air cancelled services for one day last week, standing thousands of passengers, reportedly due to delayed insurance paperwork. However, Nigeria has suffered frequent flight delays and cancellations this year, due to shortages of aviation fuel, which has reportedly doubled in price this year. Two international airlines have stopped flying to Nigeria, and others are using smaller planes, as a result of the increased prices, say reports.

US-made A321 For Spirit

Spirit Airlines has received its first US-made A321 aircraft from the Airbus manufacturing plant in Mobile, Alabama.

WLG, IVC, ZQN Win **Airport Awards**

Wellington, Invercargill and Queenstown Airports have won the top awards at the New Zealand Airports Conference, recognising recent redevelopments and ZQN's mission to introduce after-dark flights.

WLG was named Major Airport of the Year in the awards, thanks to 'impressive progress with its redevelopment of the terminal campus'. Its Terminal South extension has created an enhanced passenger experience, and it's expanding its infrastructure to keep pace with demand, investing in additional parking structures and aircraft stands, says award sponsor

IVC was named Regional Airport of the Year for the transformation of its Terminal Building following five years of planning, design and construction, which has 'lifted the spirits of those working at and passing through the airport', say judges.

New Canada Flights

Aeromexico plans to increase flights to Canada, following Canada's recent announcement to drop visa requirements for Mexicans. The routes, which serve Montreal, Toronto and Vancouver using the carrier's 16-seat Boeing 737-800, are scheduled to begin 01 Dec.

MEL Occupancy Flat

A flat year-over-year performance from Melbourne is reported in STR's preliminary Aug data for the Victorian capital. Daily data from the eighth month shows an increase in supply and demand of +2.7% with flat occupancy at 82.9%. A 0.1% decrease in ADR to AUD178.20 and flat RevPAR at AUD147.72 rounded out the gloomy news. However, Sat nights during Aug saw ADR growth, which falls more in line with the overall trend in 2016, noted the supply and demand data specialist. But a lack of weekday ADR growth subdued gains for the market despite solid occupancy, said STR.

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Europe Still Main Focus For Kiwis



Consumer travel interest in Europe remains high, with compelling airfare offers said to be helping convert interest into bookings, says one operator.

The Travel Corporation's (TTC) new united brand front was on display at last weekend's Flight Centre travel expo with its new multi-brand sales team promoting the full suite of TTC guided holidays and river cruises.

"Europe was definitely the main focus of enquiry. With the cheap airfares and the TTC flight credit deal it makes Europe extremely compelling for 2017 travel," says Tony Laskey, TTG's director of marketing and communications. "What we are seeing is the pent up demand from those that didn't travel to Europe in 2016 and those that were always planning to travel in 2017."

Laskey says the sale team noted enquiries from consumers who'd travelled on TTC brands before (such as Trafalgar or Insight) and were now looking at other options within the TTC family such as Uniworld and AAT

"Many of our previous guests hadn't realised that the associated sister companies were part of the family of brands, so the expo stand really helped to cement the connection."

In terms of trends, Laskey says the Adriatic continues to be a 'hot' destination with Kiwi travellers—along with strong enquiry for destinations such as Ireland, Italy and Scandinavia. "For many Kiwis though, they are keen to get a taste of multiple destinations so our discovery (multicountry) trips are still incredibly popular," he adds.

As well as AAT Kings, Contiki, Insight Vacations, Trafalgar and Uniworld, the expo display introduced consumers to Trafalgar's sister brand CostSaver and Insight Vacations' sister brand Luxury Gold, adds Laskey.
