Between Dec and Mar the NZ/CX alliance will operate up to three daily services between New Zealand and Hong Kong to cater to the increased seasonal demand.

The increase in flights is also supported by the arrival of CX's A350 aircraft on the route (which offers the latest in-flight technology across all three cabins), and CX is also bringing back a 777-300ER aircraft for its afternoon flight CX198, further increasing the capacity on the route.

Aircalin's New Aircraft

The carrier has also ordered two A330-900 widebody aircraft, which it will use to boost services to Japan for onward connections, and possibly open new routes such as to China. The cabin configuration of both aircraft types will be announced at a later date. "As part of our plan to boost tourism to New Caledonia, Aircalin has made a strategic decision to renew its complete fleet with the A320neo and the A330neo to grow routes and connect New Caledonia to the region," says Aircalin boss Didier Tappero. "The NEO aircraft with its state-of-the-art technology will burn less fuel, lower our operational costs and offer our loyal passengers the highest standards in cabin comfort."

More Mobile Bookings In 2017

Nearly 50% of travellers expect to plan holidays with a few taps of their smart phone and more than half expect their use of travel apps to increase in 2017.

This is the number one finding from a study of data collected by Booking. com, which has compiled a list of what travellers' expectations could very well be in the coming year.

Technology fuels a need for instant gratification—for quick answers to specific instant needs and to enhance travel by finding recommendations and short-cuts. Booking.com reckons this will increase markedly in the coming year, from finding the nearest ATM or Wi-Fi to queue jumping at top attractions and on-the-go advice on jetlag. Favourite go-to apps will evolve into travel besties capable of predicting unique needs and catering to them before travellers even ask.

Blurring lines between leisure and business travel—or so-called bleisure travel-means of the 40% of 2016 business travellers, 46% think they will travel even more in 2017, while 49% already extend trips to enjoy the destination. And 75% intend to do so the same or more in 2017, while 30% would accept a lower paid job if they could travel more for work. Becoming more adventurous is the aim of 45% and 47% would like to go where none of their friends have been, feeding a growing appetite for authentic experiences like remote villages and off-track hotels.

Bringing life balance back accounts for 48% using holidays to reflect and make better lifestyle choices. Prioritising health conscious trips is the aim with 44% interested in spa/ relaxation travel, 38% in health/wellbeing travel and 51% intending to

take more annual leave in 2017.

The trend is for travellers and accommodations to be environmentally and sustainably aware and responsible. Over a third (36%) plan more eco-friendly travel and 39% will look for an eco-tour travel experience. Increased discussion around economic incentives such as tax breaks for eco travellers is likely, while an international standard for sustainable accommodation is favoured by 41%. Paying for experiences instead of

goods is the aim of 58% with travellers becoming more interested in small moments and simple pleasures. Only 10% think a butler/concierge service is essential and 13% said high-end toiletries in hotels were necessary.

Accommodation without friendly/ helpful staff will not be used by 42% so B&Bs and Ryokan-style inns look set to be highly rated. Guest reviewing remains strong with 40% rejecting accommodation with more than three negative reviews.
