Kiwi Travel Still Up, Up And Away

Yields may be down while competition from industry disruptors is growing—but New Zealanders are continuing to make an ever increasing number of international departures.

Figures released today by Statistics New Zealand show that New Zealand residents departed on some 147,400 trips in Feb, up 20,300 trips—or 16% on Feb 2016.

The biggest changes by destination were to Australia, by far the single largest outbound market, up 11% or 7500 departures to 75,140 trips. Travel to India was also up year-on-year, with Kiwis taking 30% more (or 1780) trips in Feb to reach a total of

OF Wi-Fi Takes Off Mon

Qantas' in-flight Wi-Fi service will reportedly take off on Mon on a single 737 aircraft (VH-XZB), says Australian reports. The plane is scheduled to operate across QF's Australian domestic network, offering what's said to be the first public Wi-Fi available above Australia. QF is yet to announce when the service is expected to be rolled out on international services, including the Tasman.

6360 departures for the month under review. On the flip side Kiwi travel to Tonga slipped 49.2%, or 1300 trips, to a Feb total of 1340 departures.

. . . Ups and Downs

Looking at departures in terms of percentage highs and lows, the destinations showing the highest Kiwi Feb growth in terms of percentage were Vietnam which was up 57.1% for Feb, year-on-year, (albeit off a small base) and to New Caledonia, up 43.4%. Given the solid outbound growth across most markets there were few destinations which showed a year-onyear decline in Feb travel. However, Vanuatu's ongoing runway issues saw the destination show the biggest yearon-year percentage dip, down 18.6% on Feb 2016 to 420 trips. Also showing a decrease was Kiwi travel to France, down 4.7% on Feb last year, with Kiwis taking 160 trips in Feb.

. . . Record Feb Year

Kiwi international travel also set a new record for the year ending Feb 2017. New Zealand residents departed on 2.66 million overseas trips for the Feb year, up 10% (or 231,600 departures) on the previous year.

Kiwi Has A Quokka

A New Zealand man has reportedly surrendered his passport in Western Australia and is facing a charge of animal cruelty after allegedly throwing a quokka into the water from a jetty on Rottnest Island.

Reports say the 37-year-old did not enter a plea, was granted bail of AUD2000 and had to surrender his passport to police because he is not a WA resident.

New US Security Rules?

A tweet by Royal Jordanian has sparked speculation that the US is set to ban passengers from carrying electronic devices such as laptops on some flights from the Middle East and Africa.

In a tweet that has since been deleted, RJ said it had been instructed by the US that passengers travelling with any electronic device (excluding mobile phones and medical devices) must pack them in their checked baggage.

The ban hasn't yet been confirmed, with the Department of Homeland Security telling media that it has 'no comment on potential security precautions, but will provide any update as appropriate'.

INR Trade Recommences

Travel Money NZ has recommenced trade in the Indian Rupee (INR) following restrictions of trade brought about by the Reserve Bank of India's decision to demonetise certain bank notes in Nov last year. With many clients left holding Indian currency and not being able to exchange it, Travel Money NZ brand leader Daniel Jackson says many will welcome the news. Travel Money NZ can now exchange valid INR50, INR100, INR500 and INR2000 notes with no restrictions. They are unable to accept the notes which were demonetised, but can accept all other valid INR notes, it adds.

Airlines Fined In Europe Cartel Case

The European Commission has hit 11 carriers with EUR776 million in fines related to a price-fixing cargo cartel, which it says operated from Dec 1999-Feb 2006.

The EU originally imposed fines of almost EUR800m on the carriers in 2010 for the cargo cartel, which it says consisted of numerous contacts between airlines to fix the level of fuel and security surcharges. The original decision was annulled by the General Court on procedural grounds but has been re-adopted by the EU.

"Working together in a cartel rather than competing to offer better services to customers does not fly with the commission. Today's decision ensures that companies that were part of the air cargo cartel are sanctioned for their behaviour," says commissioner Margrethe Vestager.

The carriers fined in 2010 were Air

Canada, Air France-KLM, British Airways, Cargolux, Cathay Pacific Airways, Japan Airlines, LAN Chile, Martinair, Qantas, SAS and Singapore Airlines. Lufthansa was also involved but received full immunity from fines after bringing the cartel to the commission's attention. All but Qantas challenged the decision before the general court, which annulled the decision in Dec 2015 due to a procedural error. However, it didn't rule on the existence of the cartel, says the EU.

The commission maintains that the carriers participated in a price-fixing cartel and is adopting a new decision (which addresses the procedural error) and re-establishing the fines. Most carriers have had their fines reduced because of their coopera-

tion with the commission. AF/KL faces the largest fine with a total of EUR325m, and says it's analysing the new decision and considering its response.



NZ Fare Changes

Air New Zealand has clarified and advised of further amendments to long-term US, Canada and UK/Europe fares, following WTPS3930. Effective for sales and travel from 17 Mar, changes to US fares include an increase on fares to SFO and HOU, removal of the 21-day advance purchase business premier fare to LAX, and introduction of a T class lead-in fare to HOU in low/shoulder season. Changes in Canada include increases on select economy fares; and in UK/Europe, changes effective 24 Mar include updated seasonality and fare increases and decreases. See airnzagent.co.nz





Thai Crack-Down On Ivory Trade

Thailand is continuing efforts to end the illegal ivory trade by extending the implementation of the National Ivory Action Plan (NIAP) for another year.

This is good news as already NIAP has resulted in a dramatic drop in sales of illegal ivory within Thailand itself, say authorities. By extending the plan for another year, Thailand believes it is playing a vital part in the protection not just of its domestic elephants, but those living across the world.

Tourists can help by simply not buying any ivory products or objects that incorporate ivory, even if the object is as small as something like an earring or brooch.

By visiting and contributing to conservation centres and elephant orphanages and sanctuaries in Thailand, tourists can take part in the preservation of wild elephants as well as have the chance to learn about elephants and why they need to be protected.

If travellers come across any vendors claiming to sell ivory tusks or products, or suspect any form of wildlife trafficking, they should call the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation Hotline 1362, or Royal Thai Police, Natural Resources and Environmental Crime Suppression Division (NRECD) Hotline 1136. Bringing in, or taking any ivory out of the country is illegal and those suspected of doing so can be arrested in Thailand. There are severe penalties including imprisonment and fines.
